May's Monthly Gathering, *like ALL of our gatherings*, will be one you will not want to miss. We will be heading to Quantum Leap Farms in Odessa to spend an evening on the farm. We will learn about their incredible wounded warrior & military family programs, enjoy a BBQ, and delicious smores by a campfire.

T.A.M.P.A. will be participating in the following program:

At E.A.S.E. is an acronym which describes exactly what we are doing at Quantum Leap Farm: Equine Assisted Self Exploration. We are learning about ourselves, including our emotional and behavioral responses with the aid of horses. Horses have much to teach us about living in the moment, our approach to situations, relationships

and other people through their authentic, non-judgmental feedback. The manner in which we approach a horse and build a relationship can give us insight into building successful human relationships. It is especially effective in learning more productive responses to potentially destructive emotions and behaviors, such as combat stress, anxiety, depression, anger and grief.

At E.A.S.E. sessions are a Cognitive Behavioral approach using horses to aid individuals in exploring their "self talk" or thoughts with exercises that naturally bring emotions to the surface. This awareness allows thinking to be examined in the moment. It is this thinking that drives emotions and behaviors that can be problematic to the function of the individual. If these thoughts are openly expressed and examined there is an opportunity to replace them with more rational thoughts and behaviors and to develop Emotional Intelligence. Participants are able to see their responses clearly in the moment and thus examine their effectiveness in other areas of their lives. At E.A.S.E. sessions are experienced on the ground, on a level playing field with the horse. Eye to eye, the horse helps us to discover our authentic selves. When we are our true selves we can best examine our old responses and try out new effective ways to put ourselves At EASE during stressful situations.

Please be sure to RSVP by Wednesday, May 5th if you will be joining us as we need to know our attendance numbers in order for them to prepare in advance.

Be sure to dress comfortably, wearing close toe shoes and maybe bring along your bug spray since we will be there during the evening hours (5-9p.m.).

We will NOT be riding the horses during this visit but will be working with QL to schedule our second visit in the upcoming months. First we learn to relax with the horses and then we can have an opportunity to ride with them.

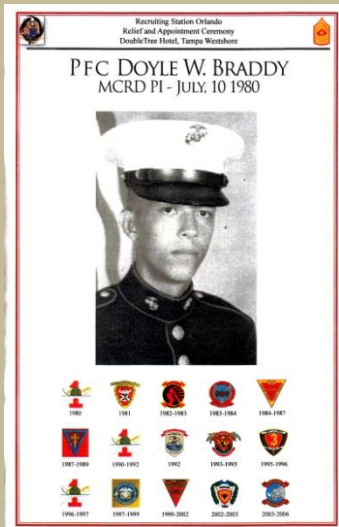
TODD Arthur J. Todd, 88, passed away March 20, 2010, in St. Petersburg. He was born in New Boston, NH and raised in Nahant, MA. He studied engineering at M.I.T. before enlisting in the U.S. Marine Corps. He was part of the first group of Marines to guard the

Mayport Naval Base in 1939, and later served in the Pacific theater of WW II as an Amtrak operator, ultimately earning the rank of Drill Sergeant. Soon after arriving in Mayport he met native Marjorie Messmore, and they married in 1941. Upon returning from the Pacific theater 'Todd' and Marge lived in Mayport and the Beaches.

Corps lifts ban on social networking sites

All Marines can now access popular social networking sites such as Facebook, Twitter and YouTube at work, and they don't even have to apply for a waiver to do so. Marine Administrative message 181/10, which dropped Monday, officially lifts the previous ban on social networking, giving Marines the access they need to check their personal e-mail or post blogs online while using the Marine Corps Enterprise Network. The move brings the Corps in line with a Feb. 26 Pentagon policy urging the services to provide access to social networking sites on nonclassified computer networks.

"The Marine Corps understands and embraces the Internet-based capabilities," said Maj. Gen. George J. Allen, the chief information officer for the Marine Corps, in a statement. "We can collaborate and enhance our business processes, and also provide a level of morale for our force that has never been seen before."

The message is a significant departure from the previous MarAdmin on social networking, released in August, which called social networking sites "a proven haven for malicious actors and content" and prohibited access on military computers unless an official waiver was granted. Only one waiver had been granted, Marine Corps Recruiting Command.

While concerns still exist, Marine officials say they plan to release additional guidelines in the near future that will provide open access to Marines while also protecting the network.

"Unlike organizations that block access to social networking for financial or resource reasons, compromises to the Marine Corps' Enterprise Network raises serious issues for protecting the safety and lives of our Marines," Allen said in the statement. "We do have a responsibility to ensure that we use the Internet in a responsible way, and that means ensuring our Marines are educated on information assurance and operations security. This policy will provide the best of both worlds — a trained force that can use the many capabilities of the Internet."

Here's a snapshot of the new policy:

- The new access is not restricted to official use. Marines can check their own personal sites as long as they have permission from their commander or supervisor, and it does not adversely affect their official duties.
- Web sites with sexually explicit content, or sites that post hate speech or military extremist activities, will remain blocked.
- Marines also are prohibited from using the Marine Corps logo or Eagle, Globe and Anchor on their personal sites. Officials say they don't want it to "give the impression of official or implied endorsement."

Officials say they intend to release an additional message in the near future with additional guidance for Marines, although it's not clear when that will be released.

Combat troops get 15 extra days of leave

A new nonchargeable rest and recuperation leave policy for troops serving in Iraq and Afghanistan announced by the Pentagon on Monday gives those deployed for 270 days or more 15 days of administrative absence on top of their regular annual leave.

“This designation provides an additional benefit specifically for those service members deployed to the most arduous combat areas,” Sam Retherford, the Pentagon’s director of officer and enlisted personnel management, said in a statement. “Administrative absence days, in conjunction with government-funded transportation for R&R, allow service members to save and use their annual leave for reintegration with their families and communities when they return home.”

The benefits for Iraq and Afghanistan are effective Tuesday, March 23, the Pentagon said.

Granting of the days is contingent upon mission requirements and authorized only for those service members who take part in the Non-Chargeable Rest and Recuperation program.

The no-charge administrative leave program is being limited to those in the “most arduous” areas, Retherford said.

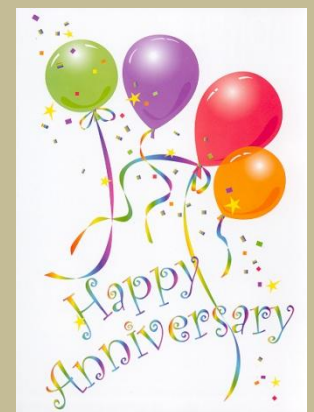
Combatant commanders can ask the Pentagon to designate additional locations for the NCR&R if the area/location:

- Is a place where U.S. forces have been engaged in combat operations against a hostile force within the last six months and where actual combat operations are expected to continue.
- Meets R&R leave program criteria.
- Is in a combat zone designated by presidential executive order.
- Is in an area where service members are exposed to the most arduous conditions (for example, locations for which Hardship Duty Pay is authorized).
